Amit Shah to release BJP's J&K poll manifesto tomorrow

JAMMU: Union Home Minister Amit Shah will release the Bharatiya Janata Party's manifesto for Jammu and Kashmir Assembly elections on September 6 and address rallies in Jammu to kickstart the party's campaign. The three-phase Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir are to be held on September 18, September 25 and October 1 and the counting will be held on October 8. "Amit Shah will be arriving here on Sept 6 to release the party's manifesto and address political rallies," said a senior BJP leader.

IMD issues orange & yellow alert for heavy rainfall across India

NEW DELHI: India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Wednesday issued orange and yellow alert for heavy to very heavy rainfall over many parts of India including western and South Peninsular for the next five days. According to IMD, "Heavy to very heavy rainfall likely over Gujarat & Rajasthan today and over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Telangana during the next 2 days and decrease thereafter." The weather department also predicted the formation of a low-pressure area over westcentral and adjoining northwest Bay of Bengal by tomorrow as a cyclonic circulation lies over north Coastal Andhra Pradesh and neighbourhood in lower & middle tropospheric levels. "The monsoon trough is active and its western end is near its normal position and eastern end is south of its normal position at mean sea level. It is likely to continue so for next 2-3 days," the IMD said.

Gold slumps Rs 450 to Rs 73,600 per 10 gram

NEW DELHI: Gold prices slumped by Rs 450 to Rs 73,600 per 10 grams in the national capital on Wednesday, extending losses for the third straight session amid a decline in precious metal rates in the overseas markets. In the previous session, the yellow metal of 99.9 per cent purity had closed at Rs 74,050 per 10 grams. Silver prices also plummeted by Rs 1,650 to Rs 83,600 per kilogram from Rs 85,250 per kg in the previous close, according to the All India Sarafa Association.

BJP releases first list for Haryana, Nayab Saini to contest from Ladwa

Vij from Ambala Cantt, Gian Chand fielded from Panchkula

BJP has released its first list of 67 candidates for Haryana Assembly polls here on Wednesday. The safe party has decided to field CM Nayab Saini from Ladwa constituency and party stalwart Anil Vij will contest from Ambala Cantt. Shruti Chaudhary will be party candidate from Tosham whereas Shakti Rani Sharma will contest from Kalka. Aarti Rao daughter of Union Minister Inderjit Rao has been given ticket from Ateli. Asseem Goyal from Ambala City, Mukesh Sharma from Gurugram, Dinesh Kaushik from Bahadurgarh, Kamal Gupta from Hisar, Bhavya Bishnoi from Adampur, Sunita Duggal from Ratia and Gian Chand Gupta will contest from Panchkula.

On the other hand Congress and the Aam Aadmi Party have reached an 'in-principle understanding' to fight next month's Haryana Assembly election together, sources told.

The next step is divvying up the Assembly's 90 seats - a potentially tricky topic.

Sources said that in the early exchanges the AAP has demanded 10 seats, while the Congress is willing to give between five and seven only. The Congress is reportedly also willing to give one seat to the Samajwadi Party of ex Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Akhilesh Yadav.



The nomination process will start from Thursday and papers will be accepted daily, excluding Sunday, September 8. The official said that only four persons, including the candidate, are permitted to accompany the candidate to the SDM office during the nomination process. "Adherence to these guidelines is crucial for maintaining order during the nomination period," he added.

Vinesh, Bajrang meet Rahul, may contest Assembly election

NEW DELHI: Ahead of the Haryana Assembly election, wrestlers Vinesh Phogat and Bajrang Punia on Wednesday met former Congress President and Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi, giving a buzz that both the decorated wrestlers may enter the political arena.

The Indian National Congress on its social media handle X has posted a photo of Bajrang Punia and Vinesh Phogat with Rahul Gandhi captioned, "Vinesh Phogat ji and Bajrang Punia ji met Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi".

With the meeting of the wrestlers with Rahul Gandhi, there are speculations in the political circles that Vinesh Phogat and Bajrang Punia may contest the upcoming Haryana assembly election on the Congress ticket.

These speculations gained momentum as both the wrestlers had a long meeting with Congress General Secretary KC Venugopal.

It is being said that former Chief Minister of the Haryana Bhupindra Singh Hooda is in favour of giving tickets to both the players. If Congress ensures to give them tickets then both can resign from the government jobs they got through sports quota.

Rahul Gandhi bats for J-K statehood; slams Centre for snatching identity, rights

Lok Sabha Leader of Opposition and Congress MP Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday advocated for the restoration of the region's statehood, asserting that the withdrawal of its autonomous status has not only snatched the state of its identity but also eroded the rights and resources of its people.

While addressing an election rally in Ramban ahead of the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly Election, the Congress leader said, "For the first time in the history of India, statehood has been snatched away. Union Territory was first made a state... A state has been abolished and the rights of the people have been snatched away. First of all, the statehood of Jammu and Kashmir has to be returned because not only your state has been snatched away, your rights, your wealth, everything is being snatched away from you."

"We wanted that you should first get statehood and then elections should be held. But the BJP does not want this, they say that first elections will be held and then the issue of statehood will be discussed. We are saying that whatever happens, we will get statehood for the people of Jammu and Kashmir. Whether the BJP wants it or not, we will exert so much pressure that the people of Jammu and Kashmir will have to be given statehood," he added.

Rahul Gandhi launched a



scathing attack on the current administrative setup in Jammu and Kashmir, drawing a parallel between the region's past monarchical rule and its present governance.

"In 1947, we removed the kings, formed a democratic government and gave a Constitution to the country. But... Today, there is a 'king' named LG sitting in Jammu and Kashmir, who is snatching your money and giving it to outsiders.

SC presses pause on its order on lawyers' attendance

The Supreme Court on Wednesday agreed to defer its decision which said that only lawyers who are present in court physically or online during hearings can mark their appearance in court records.

Senior Advocate Kapil Sibal, who is also the president of the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA), mentioned the matter before a Bench comprising Justice J K Maheshwari and Justice Rajesh Bindal and sought time to resolve the issue.

The Court then agreed to defer its order

passed on August 29.

The bench put the order on hold for a week. The matter will next be heard on September 11.

On August 29, the Bench directed that only lawyers who were present in the court physically or online during hearings would be allowed to mark their appearance for cases (in the record of court proceedings, orders or judgments). That order was passed while hearing a batch of part-heard contempt petitions. During a hearing, the Court observed that the name of a lawyer, who was not in the town, had entered his name in the list of lawyers who had appeared for the proceedings.

Committed to ensure exemplary punishment to perpetrators of sacrilege incident: CM Mann

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, SEPT 4

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann on Wednesday said that the state government is firmly committed to ensure exemplary punishment to the perpetrators of the sacrilege incidents and a fresh report regarding the matter will be filed soon.

Taking part in discussions during the session of Punjab Vidhan Sabha, the Chief Minister said that the state government has got major clues in the sacrilege incidents and a fresh report to ensure that the perpetrators get the punishment for their sins. He said that the report has already been sent by the state government for legal vetting so that no one escapes galloos for their involvement in this crime. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that the day is not far away when the culprits of this heinous crime will be seen behind the bars adding that unlike the previous governments they will not leave any stone unturned for this.

Slamming the previous governments for adopting a soft approach towards this highly emotive issue, the Chief

Minister said that due to this laxity the criminals who have bruised the psyche of Sikhs by committing such unpardonable crime are still roaming free. Reiterating the firm commitment of his government to punish the perpetrators of sacrilege incidents in the state, he



said that it is the bounden duty of his government to ensure that these dreaded criminals get punishment. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that every person who has been hand in glove in this crime will be ensured exemplary punishment for this sin.

No relief yet for Kangana Ranaut's 'Emergency', she claims court win

Kangana Ranaut's movie 'Emergency', at the centre of a massive row after Sikh organisations opposed its release, got no relief from the Bombay High Court today. The court said it cannot ask the Central Board of Film Certification (CBFC) to issue a certificate to the film's makers as it would contradict a Madhya Pradesh High Court order.

Despite the setback, the actor and BJP MP claimed a win in court. "High court has blasted censor for illegally withholding the certificate of #emergency," she said in a post on X.



The movie is co-produced by Ms Ranaut's Manikarnika Films and Zee Studios. With the film earlier scheduled for a release on September 6, Zee Entertainment Enterprises approached the Bombay High Court, seeking a direction to Censor Board to issue the certificate that

would clear the decks for the film's release. The setback in Bombay High Court means that the movie is unlikely to release anytime soon.

The movie, based on the Emergency imposed by the Indira Gandhi government in 1975, ran into trouble after the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, the apex religious body for Sikhs, alleged that it misrepresents Sikhs and sought a ban. Ms Ranaut later said the Censor Board had put on hold the certificate issued to her film. Sources in the government said some religious organisations have raised concerns about the film. "Religious sentiments cannot be hurt. There is some sensitive content in the movie," a

source said, adding that the Centre was seriously looking at the concerns.

Two Sikh organisations filed a Public Interest Litigation against the movie in Madhya Pradesh High Court. In its response, the Censor Board told the court that the movie had not been issued a certificate. The court then disposed of the petition. Arguing the matter in court, Zee's counsel, Senior Advocate Venkatesh Dhond, told the bench of Justice BP Colabawalla and Justice Firdosh Pooniwalla that CBFC informed Manikarnika Films on August 8 that film is suitable for unrestricted public exhibition, subject to some modifications.

Drugs seized in 413 cases

Drugs seized in 413 cases registered by Kurukshetra, Yamunanagar and Ambala police included poppy husk - 14 quintal 75 kg 266 grams 35 mg, ganja - 01 quintal 40 kg 275 grams, charas - 03 kg 303 grams, smack - 01 kg 326 grams 897 mg, heroin - 02 kg 158 grams 824 mg, sulphur - 17 grams and 123235 capsules, 189684 intoxicating tablets, 661 injections and 427 vials of syrup were destroyed in 49 cases of intoxicating drugs. Superintendent of Police Varun Singla said that earlier the intoxicants seized in decided and pending cases were burnt in fire using wood. Due to which the environment was badly affected and the process was also costly. To save the environment, after deliberations by the high officials at the state level, it was decided that such substances should be destroyed at a place where burning them does not have any adverse effect on the environment.

Patiala Administration imposes ban on sale of high-dose pregabalin to curb drug misuse

In a decisive move to address the growing misuse of certain pharmaceutical drugs in Patiala, the Additional Deputy Commissioner-cum-Additional District Magistrate, Kanchan, has imposed a complete ban on the sale of Pregabalin capsules and tablets in formulations exceeding 75 mg across the district. This ban comes into immediate effect and will remain in place until November 2, 2024.

The decision follows numerous reports from social organizations, NGOs, and media outlets highlighting the widespread abuse of Pregabalin formulations above 75 mg, which are being openly sold and misused as habit-forming drugs. A committee, led by the Civil Surgeon of Pa-



tiala, was formed to investigate the availability and impact of these high-dose Pregabalin formulations. The committee's findings confirmed that these drugs are frequently misused and are seldom prescribed by medical professionals. The Civil Surgeon recommended a prohibition on the sale of Pregabalin 300 mg to protect public health and support the Government of Punjab's zero-tolerance policy

against drug abuse. Following consultations with representatives of the Indian Medical Association and Chemists Associations in Patiala, who corroborated the widespread abuse of these drugs, the Additional District Magistrate concluded that a strict ban on Pregabalin formulations over 75 mg is necessary. Additionally, the sale of Pregabalin up to 75 mg will be closely regulated. A complete ban on the stocking and sale of Pregabalin capsules/tablets exceeding 75 mg across all wholesalers, retailers, chemists, medical stores, and pharmacies, including those within hospitals in Patiala. Pregabalin up to 75 mg can only be sold upon presentation of an original prescription slip. Sellers must maintain detailed records of purchases and sales.

During financial year 2024-25, as of July 2024, Rs 26.59 crore is recovered from 14160 ineligible and deceased beneficiaries.

CM defends delayed salary payment, says move to save Rs 36 cr annually

Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu on Wednesday defended the government's decision to delay payment of salaries and pensions by a few days each month as a fiscally prudent measure and asserted that the state's finances are under control with the government working to become debt-free by 2027.

Addressing the Legislative Assembly, Sukhu emphasized that this deferral would save the state an estimated Rs 36 crore annually, reducing the burden of borrowing.

Sukhu clarified that the government's move to defer employee salaries to the 5th and pensions to the 10th of each month is aimed at managing the state's finances more effectively. The



decision stems from the timing of the central government's remittance of the Rs 520 Cr as Revenue Deficit Grant (RDG) and Rs 740 Cr as share in Central Taxes respectively released on 6th and 10th of each month. The Chief Minister highlighted that paying salaries and pensions on the first of every month would necessitate borrowing Rs 40 crore at a 7.5% interest rate, incurring an additional Rs 36

crore in interest annually.

By adjusting the payment dates, the government intends to avoid this financial strain, ensuring better fiscal management without compromising on the timely disbursement of salaries and pensions, he said. Sukhu assured the Assembly that the decision is not indicative of a financial crisis but a step towards fiscal prudence. The Chief Minister further stated that this change would not

affect autonomous bodies like the Himachal Road Transport Corporation (HRTC) and the State Electricity Board, which will continue to disburse salaries on the 1st of each month.

Responding to concerns raised by the Opposition, Sukhu dismissed the notion that the state is facing a financial crisis. He asserted that the state's finances are under control and that the government is actively working to become debt-free by 2027 and financially self-reliant by 2032. The Chief Minister also took a dig at the previous BJP government, accusing it of mismanagement and leaving behind significant liabilities.

Earlier, Leader of Opposition Jai Ram Thakur raised concerns over the delayed payments, questioning the government's handling of the situation.

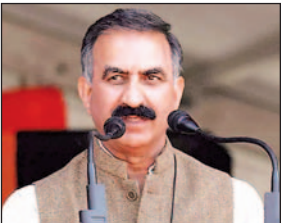

Assembly expands scope of green construction norms

Aiming to check unregulated construction and its environmental impact, the Himachal Pradesh Assembly on Tuesday passed an amendment to the Town and Country Planning (TCP) Act, 2024, extending its reach to regulate construction on plots over 1,000 square meters outside the state's notified planning areas. The move comes as a response to the recent devastation caused by landslides and floods, with the aim of ensuring the structural stability of buildings and proper drainage systems to prevent further tragedies.

The amendment, introduced by Town and Country Planning Minister Rajesh Dharmani, mandates



that any building constructed on a plot exceeding 1,000 square meters, regardless of its location within or outside designated planning areas, must receive approval from the TCP department.

This amendment seeks to curb haphazard construction, which has often been linked to increased landslide occurrences, particularly in the monsoon seasons of 2023 and 2024. Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu emphasized that the amendment does not alter

existing provisions of the TCP Act but instead extends regulatory oversight to constructions in non-planning areas. He cited the example of a Taj Hotel near Theog, which could not be regulated under the current law, to illustrate the necessity of this amendment. The new provisions will cover similar commercial and private properties outside the previously governed zones.

During the debate, concerns were raised by both the ruling and Opposition members regarding the impact of the amendment on rural areas. Lahaul-Spiti MLA Anuradha Rana highlighted that the district's limited habitable area made the enforcement of the TCP law challenging and requested exemptions or modifications for such unique regions.

High Court grants relief to sellers for 156 banned pharma products

The High Court's stay order allows sellers to continue selling their existing stock of these products. which ensures that patients continue to have access to these trusted treatment options." He emphasized that IFPG represents over 156 pharmaceutical companies engaged in the research, development, manufacturing, and marketing of generic drugs in India. The organization is committed to promoting affordable and high-quality healthcare solutions both within India and internationally.

Numerous prominent pharmaceutical companies, including Liford Healthcare,

Lupin, Intas, Torque, Ajanta, Smartway, Smart Laboratories, Cadila Pharma, Curatek Group, Morvin India Laboratories, G Laboratories, Syncom, Coron Remedies, Microlab, Bokard, Master Health Innovation, Alba Debit, Jackson Pal, Bestochem, Biochem, Indico, and Anglo-French, have welcomed the High Court's decision in line with IFPG's stance. Sumit Singla, the Vice President of IFPG Himachal Pradesh, IDMA member, and Managing Director of Curatek Group, also praised the High Court's stay order. He urged all manufacturers affected by the ban on the 156 pharmaceutical products to unite and file appeals with the High Court. He highlighted the importance of this collective action to prevent the loss of raw materials and packaging stock worth crores of rupees.

In a letter to the Administrator, the Mayor said the MC remained dependent on financial assistance provided by the Chandigarh Administration in the shape of grant-in-aid. In addition to this, the MC's own revenue was also being utilised to meet the day-to-day expenditure and other development works being undertaken by the MC.

The letter said the MC was providing the facilities to the general public on no profit, no loss basis. It has collected around Rs 323 crore in revenue through property tax, water connections and bills, bookings of various spaces, Apni Mandis, advertisements, auctions



penalties and rent from MC shops. The letter further says the revenue receipts are not sufficient to cope up with the financial crunch of the MC. Therefore, necessary instructions may be issued to the Chandigarh Administration to release the proceeds of taxes

under the provisions of the Punjab Municipal Corporation Act, 1976.

The total revenue of MC for the financial year 2023-24 was Rs 1,042 crore inclusive of the Rs 560 crore grant-in-aid received from the Chandigarh Administration. The expenditure of the Municipal Corpora-

tion during the financial year 2023-24 was Rs 1,143 crore. The difference between the receipt and expenditure is approximately Rs 100 crore.

Now, for the 2024-25 financial year, Rs 200 crore are required in addition to the sanc-

tioned grant-in-aid. Besides, expenditure on account of arrear, salary and pension under the Seventh Central Pay Commission, increase in wages rate, electricity charges and other miscellaneous expenditure on the various ongoing projects have also increased.

Editorial

The golden Twenties

The past is many things, from being freewheeling nostalgia to becoming an imagined site of humiliation crying out for revenge. Whatever else it is, it certainly is an eloquent crystal ball showing up the present in its true colours. The present has always been an enigma to the human mind, turning ‘Who am I?’ into a complex philosophical question. Be it for an individual, or for a given society, the clues for deciding who one is need to be located in the past. Invariably, the present identity is a gestalt of the lengthening shadows of many bygone spots of time.

As I think of myself and my India during the 2020s, I tend to turn to many pasts that have come together to form the present. Towards that quest, three past decades stand out as having shaped the India of recent times: the 1990s, the 1940s and the 1920s. The 1990s unfolded phenomenal political and economic events, while the 1940s were the years filled with epoch-making historical developments. In comparison, the 1920s were less dramatic, yet profoundly impactful, for India. That decade gave rise to a new sensibility, which shaped the essentials of India’s modernity. Since we are in the 2020s, it is somewhat amusing to turn back and see from a century’s distance what India was doing in the 1920s.

The decade was bracketed between M.K. Gandhi establishing the Gujarat Vidyapith in 1920 and the world-famous Dandi yatra in 1930; between B.R. Ambedkar launching Mooknayak in 1920 and his signing of the Poona Pact in 1932; it was also bracketed between the birth of Vikram Sarabhai in August 1919 and C.V. Raman’s Nobel Prize for Physics in 1930, between the birth of the Kathak dancer, Sitara Devi, in 1920 and the birth of Chandralekha in 1928. As for the most illustrious among India’s spiritual leaders, we see the Ramana ashram of Ramana Maharshi set up in 1922 and Sri Aurobindo’s realisation of a ‘divine consciousness’ in 1926.

The 1920s were beginning to bring exceptional talent from small-town India to shape the nation’s sensibility. Some of the world-famous and entirely modern painters of India were born in small towns or agrarian cities. F.N. Souza born at Saligao in Goa in 1924; S.H. Raza born at Kakkaiya in 1922; V.S. Gaitonde at Nagpur in 1924 and Tyeb Mehta at Kapadvanj in 1925 are no ordinary names. Their paintings have enthralled art collectors and museum-goers in global cultural centres. Close to my town of residence, Dharwad, is a village called Ron (or Rona). Its current population is less than 25,000. A century ago, it was just a few thousand.

Pakistan cracks down on civil servants' free speech

The Pakistan government recently issued a directive prohibiting civil servants from speaking on media and social media platforms without prior authorization, as reported by Express News Pakistan.

According to the office memorandum issued by the Establishment Division, current regulations require government employees to obtain permission before making any statements on media platforms.

Additionally, civil servants are barred from disclosing official documents or information to unauthorized individuals, the public, or the media.

The memorandum further stipulates that government employees must not express opinions or disclose facts on media or social media that could harm the reputation of the Pakistani government.

They are also prohibited from making comments against policy decisions or national sovereignty, and from making statements that might influence international relations. Civil servants are expected to maintain neutrality and avoid participating in social media discussions.

These restrictions on social media in Pakistan have faced criticism from



both domestic and international observers, raising concerns about potential infringements on freedom of speech, impacts on civil liberties, and broader implications for democratic engagement.

The Pakistani government has also advised monitoring social media platforms to remove any offensive content. Federal secretaries, additional secretaries, department heads, and

chief secretaries are tasked with enforcing adherence to these guidelines by removing objectionable content.

Pakistan’s score of 30 out of 100 on the assessment report index reflects concerns that the government placed curbs on free speech, especially regarding discussions about the pandemic and related information.

Recent instances have shown the government targeting specific social

media accounts and news outlets, often coinciding with political tensions or attempts to control narratives around sensitive issues.

Amendments to the Prevention of Electronic Crimes Act (PECA) were introduced to address what the government terms “cybercrime,” but critics argue that these amendments could be used to target dissent and suppress criticism.

Hypersonic missile scientist found guilty of treason by Russian Court

A physicist who worked on hypersonic weapons technology was found guilty of treason by a Russian court, reported Al Jazeera.

According to Russia’s TASS news agency, the Moscow court found Alexander Shpiluyuk guilty in a closed-door trial on Tuesday and sentenced him to 15 years in a prison colony.

He was the most recent team member to be prosecuted who worked on military technologies.

In addition, the court condemned Shpiluyuk to a further 1.5 years of limited freedom and fined him 500,000 rubles (USD 5,650), according to Russian news agency TASS. Not much is known about the accusations made against Shpiluyuk, who oversaw the Khristianovich Institute of Theoretical and Applied Mechanics in Novosibirsk, Siberia.

Citing Russian media, Al Jazeera reported that Shpiluyuk was accused of passing information to foreign officials on hypersonic technology, cutting-edge



weapons capable of carrying payloads at up to 10 times the speed of sound to punch through air defence systems.

Shpiluyuk is one of the almost twelve scientists who have been accused of treason in the last several years, the Al Jazeera report added.

Numerous individuals from his establishment, which asserts to be officially recognised as a component of Russia’s military-industrial complex, have been charged.

Depression and misleading information

According to a recent study conducted in Finland, people frequently receive inaccurate information on depression. The researchers claim that people find it more difficult to comprehend the reasons for their discomfort as a result of the false information.

The majority of mental health diagnoses are only descriptive. For instance, a diagnosis of depression does not identify the underlying reason; rather, it describes the range of psychiatric symptoms. However, depression is frequently discussed as a condition characterised by poor mood and other symptoms.

Researchers describe this as a form of circular reasoning, which means that psychiatric diagnoses are frequently talked about circularly, as if they described the causes of symptoms. This makes it difficult for people to understand their distress.

"Depression should be considered a diagnosis similar to a headache. Both are medical diagnoses, but neither explains what causes the symptoms. Like a headache, depression is a description of a problem that



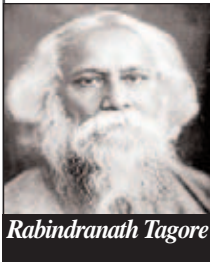
can have many different causes. A diagnosis of depression does not explain the cause of depressed mood any more than a diagnosis of headaches explains the cause of pain in the head," said Jani Kajanoja, a postdoctoral researcher and a medical doctor specialising in psychiatry at the University of Turku in Finland.

This misconception is also perpetuated by mental health professionals, shows a recent study by the University of Turku and the University of the Arts Helsinki.

New research on TB could change how we treat inflammatory disorders

Tuberculosis is a perplexing disease. It is the largest cause of mortality from infectious disease worldwide, however, it is believed that such deaths account for just around 5 per cent of Mycobacterium tuberculosis (Mtb) infections. Antibiotics can be credited with saving the lives of some Mtb patients, but there is still a gap between the prevalence of infection and the intended severity of its effects. An increasing body of research implies that genetic susceptibility to tuberculosis accounts for the disparity.

Now, researchers at The Rockefeller University have discovered another unusual mutation that makes its carriers far more likely to develop tuberculosis—but not other infectious diseases. This finding, which was recently published in Nature, has the potential to challenge long-held beliefs about the immune system.

It's long been known that an acquired deficiency of a pro-inflammatory cytokine called TNF is linked to an increased risk of developing TB. The current study, led by Rockefeller's Stephanie Boisson-Dupuis and Jean-Laurent Casanova, revealed a genetic cause of TNF deficiency, as well as the underlying mechanism: a lack of TNF incapacitates a specific immune



process in the lungs, leading to severe—but surprisingly targeted—illness.

The findings suggest that TNF, long considered a key galvanizer of the immune response,

might actually play a much narrower role—a discovery with far-reaching clinical implications.

"The past 40 years of scientific literature have attributed a wide variety of pro-inflamma-

tory functions to TNF," says Casanova, head of the St. Giles Laboratory of Human Genetics of Infectious Diseases. "But beyond protecting the lungs against TB, it may have a limited role in inflammation and immunity."

Casanova's lab has been studying the genetic causes of TB for more than two decades through field work in several countries and a wide network of collaborating physicians across the world. They maintain an ever-growing database of whole-exome sequences from a global pool of patients—more than 25,000 people to date. Of those, some 2,000 have had TB.

Over the years they've identified several rare genetic mutations that render some people vulnerable to TB. For example, mutations in a gene called CYBB can disable an immune mechanism called the respiratory burst, which produces chemicals called reactive oxygen species (ROS). Despite its pulmonary-sounding name, the respiratory burst takes place in immune cells throughout the body.

ROS help pathogen-consuming white blood cells called phagocytes (from the Greek for "eating") to destroy the invaders they've devoured. If ROS aren't produced, those pathogens can

thrive unchecked, leading to debilitating complications. As a result, carriers of this CYBB mutation become vulnerable to not just TB but to a wide variety of infectious diseases.

For the current study, the team suspected that a similar inborn error of immunity may lay behind the severe, recurring TB infections experienced by two people in Colombia—a 28-year-old woman and her 32-year-old cousin—who had been repeatedly hospitalized with significant lung conditions. In each cycle, they initially responded well to anti-TB antibiotics, but within a year, they were sick again.

Puzzlingly, however, their long-term health records showed that their immune systems functioned normally, and that they were otherwise healthy.

To find out why they were particularly prone to getting TB, the researchers performed whole-exome sequencing on the two, as well as a genetic analysis of their respective parents and relatives.

The two were the only members of their extended family with a mutation in the TNF gene, which encodes for proteins linked to the regulation of a variety of biological processes.

District level malaria working committee meeting held

KARNAL: The Civil Surgeon informed that a meeting of the District Level Malaria Working Committee was organized on Wednesday under the chairmanship of Additional Deputy Commissioner Yash Jaluka. In the meeting, Deputy Civil Surgeon Dr. Anu Sharma (VBD) welcomed the officers from all the departments and also requested for cooperation in the prevention of dangerous diseases like bacterial diseases such as malaria, dengue, JE and chikungunya. Dr. Anu Sharma said that there are 2 sub-divisional hospitals, 8 CHCs, 25 PHCs, 150 sub-centers in the district, which are providing health services in the district. He said that the figures of malaria have reduced significantly since last years, there were 2 cases in the year 2020, 0 cases in the year 2021, 1 case in the year 2022, 2 cases in the year 2023, while there is no case so far this year. These figures show that we have been able to control malaria to a great extent. He said that there were 93 cases of dengue in the year 2020, 304 cases in the year 2021, 335 cases in the year 2022, 501 cases in the year 2023 and 25 cases have been reported till September 3 this year. Malaria can be controlled by anti-larva activity done by the department and RT given to malaria positive cases, but the only means to control dengue is cleanliness, because dengue mosquito breeds only in clean water. Cleanliness is possible only with the cooperation of all. The Deputy Civil Surgeon (VBD) also informed that various types of IEC activities are being done for the prevention of malaria/dengue, under which flexes and banners have been installed at various places in the city to create awareness about malaria/dengue.

One and a half years ago, the existing Gram Panchayat had the Johad excavated by emptying it with the help of JCB. It is alleged that the villagers kept the water supply water open and dumped their cattle dung and polythene in the Johad, due to which the Johad overflowed in

just a year. Then the villagers had said that an engine should be kept here permanently. The Gram Panchayat had even kept the engine there, but some mischievous element of the village dropped it in the Johad. The Panchayat took it away. After this, it was not kept again. Anyway, the Gram Panchayat says that the pipe laid from Ranbir Nagar to Kachhwa is completely damaged. It has been repaired many times, now water cannot be drained from this pipeline. It needs to be laid again. A written request has been made to the state government for this. Village residents Hemraj, Rajesh, Rinku, Rajkumar, Ishwar, Gullu, Motiram said that the lanes of their village were to be raised and the work is getting delayed.

The people of the entire village are suffering from dirty water. There is an abundance of flies and mosquitoes here, and their pleas are not being heard anywhere. They have also raised the problem of their pond before the Chief Minister's wife."
